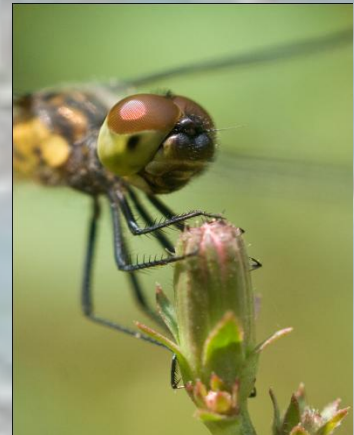


# Mass Audubon's Long Pasture Wildlife Sanctuary Presents February Vacation Wonders

Male and female Great Horned Owls are hooting to each other during their mid-winter mating season and seeking abandoned nests to take over. We'll head outdoors after a short presentation. Who knows what other winter wonders we may discover?
